

Onlooker Type 1: This person helps the kid who bullys; and also joins in with the bullying.

Onlooker Type 2: This person witnesses the bullying taking place; but stays away and seldom take sides.

Onlooker Type 3: This person comforts the person being bullied; and actively tries to stop the bullying.

Onlooker Type 4: This person provides support and encouragement to the kid who bullys; and offers them ideas to make the bullying worse.

"Can't Someone Else Do It?"
